WHO WE ARE

ReForest London is a charitable, non-profit organization dedicated to partnering with our community to enhance environmental and human health in the Forest City through the benefits of trees.

Since 2005, ReForest London has planted 36,928 native trees and shrubs in 238 projects throughout London and has run over 287 outreach, education and other tree-related events. We rely on strong community and governmental partnerships and the help of nearly 30,000 volunteers to support our work to keep the "forest" in the Forest City. ReForest London is a Founding Partner of London's Million Tree Challenge.

MILLION TREE CHALLENGE

Together we're making London greener, and 2013 was an amazing year for growing awareness and support of London's Million Tree Challenge.

Progress was made toward the goal of planting one million trees with 173,910 trees registered to date.

Sponsorship of the Million Tree Challenge grew in 2013 with 9 Partners donating money, led by our first \$50,000 Platinum Sponsor, Scotiabank. There were also 31 project sponsors who made a commitment to a healthier London.

2013 saw the development of important Million Tree Challenge support material, including a comprehensive Partner Kit, a great new Million Tree Challenge video, and a London-made animation which sums up the Million Tree Challenge in 60 seconds.

There was a 100% increase of Million Tree Challenge Partners - from 75 to 150. Media Partnerships were developed with CTV, The Londoner, 102.3 BOBfm, The London Free Press and Rogers TV London, with the Million Tree Challenge receiving a lot of great publicity.









ReForest London gave away over 9,000 seedlings at various events, including: The Home & Garden Show, Western Fair, and National Tree Day.

MTC Partners supported National Tree Day in a big way, with 22 Partners giving away seedlings and trees at 44 different locations across London.

The Citywide Tree Sale was increased to ten days and the eight participating garden centres and nurseries sold 512 trees during the sale.

The first annual Partner celebration, A Toast to Trees, was held at Museum London with a turnout of over 150 people who enjoyed an informative program, delicious food & drink, fun activities, and the unveiling of the Kids Talk Trees video. This event thanked Partners and celebrated the successes of London's Million Tree Challenge.

2013 was an exciting year of growth and development moving London further along the path of planting one million more trees and a healthier community for all.





NATURALIZATIONS

Our volunteers were out in force this year planting over 5,600 native trees and shrubs in parks, industrial areas, and institutional lands. In parks all over the city, we created new woodlands, expanded existing woodlands, and added to past planting projects. These projects clean our air and water, create passive recreational space, and increase London's woodland cover.

Industrial landowners London Life, TRY Recycling, and Bucher Hydraulics opened their lands for planting, creating spaces for employee breaks, improving their properties, and creating a more sustainable future. We continued to plant the Celebration Forest behind Parkwood Hospital, and another institutional landowner, Mary Immaculate Parish, planted trees next to the church.

These projects are the most ecologically impactful, creating new woodlands, improving local ecosystems, and creating new wildlife habitats.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

ReForest London spent 2013 connecting with London's communities, neighbourhoods, and citizens. Our dedicated team of volunteers spent well over a thousand hours at over 50 community events in every corner of the city, speaking to their friends and neighbours.

Million Tree Challenge Partners welcomed us at their events such as the Western Eco-Fair, the Fanshawe College Seedling Giveaway, and the London and St. Thomas Association of REALTORS AGM. We also attended exciting events such as Forest City Road Races, Western Fair, the London Pride Parade, and the London Spring Home and Garden Show.

We launched our Lunch and Learn program that offers speakers to community groups and Million Tree Challenge Partners. Topics include Native Trees, Emerald Ash Borer, and the Benefits of Trees.

Through the efforts of our volunteers, we reached over 20,000 people at our booths and gave away 9,400 seedlings.





NEIGHBOURHOOD TREE CAPTAIN

This year, with the support of the Ontario Trillium Foundation, we launched an exciting new program to promote tree planting in residential areas, thus channelling the passion people have for their neighbourhoods. We know that 40% of "plantable" space in London is on private property – in our own backyards. We train and support Neighbourhood Tree Captains to champion tree planting in their own neighbourhoods.

With training and help from ReForest London, our 50 Captains have led tree sales and giveaways, gone door to door offering advice and access to trees, and assessed public boulevards for possible tree planting locations.

Trees in neighbourhoods reduce our heating and cooling costs, make our streets safer and more walkable, and increase property values. They provide the perfect green canopy of privacy, while encouraging us to spend more time playing, gardening and relaxing outdoors. We are eager to watch this program and its benefits continue to grow.





TREE SALES

Our community tree sales made it easier for Londoners to learn about and access native trees. Community groups and institutions hosted tree sales at nine events, and over 1,300 native trees were sold.

Tree sale hosts included: London Health Sciences Centre, Hamilton Road Community Association, Argyle Community Association, London Bridge Childcare, Old South Community Organization, Friends of Meadowlily Woods, Western University, and the City of London.

Tree sales are a great way for groups to promote London's Million Tree Challenge and get trees into their neighbourhoods.

TREECYCLE

In 2013 we launched TreeCycle, a program that invites citizens to pot self-seeded trees from their yards and donate them twice a year. Donors receive a charitable receipt for the value of their trees. This first year, 174 trees were donated, 169 of which were native.

TreeCycle trees were used in naturalization projects, and were also distributed to residents by our Neighbourhood Tree Captains. Having free trees can make the difference between someone being able to plant one or not. TreeCycle gives Londoners a different way to get involved in the Million Tree Challenge, right from their own yards.

The spirit of donating trees was so strong that we had spontaneous donations of 3,091 trees outside of the TreeCycle events. We also had several volunteers grow trees to donate, so that's an option to help get trees in the ground.

We're all lucky to live in a city where people care so much about trees. It's a win-win for the trees and Londoners.



SCHOOLYARD GREENING

Planting trees in schools creates new learning spaces, brings shade and protection from harmful UV rays, cools indoor and outdoor spaces, and gives students a natural environment to play and recharge for learning. In 2013, we planted 432 trees and shrubs in nine schoolyard projects with the help of over 2,000 students.

Students enthusiastically participate in all our schoolyard greening projects, from helping to plan where the trees will be planted, to planting and caring for the trees. Outdoor classrooms are part of many of our schoolyard projects, and teachers and students alike love these creative learning and playing environments. A set of K-12 tree-related lesson plans keeps students connected to trees long after the project.

CELEBRATION FOREST

Over 350 people gathered to plant trees in memory and in celebration at 2013's Celebration Forest Tree Planting Ceremony in May. The Celebration Forest, located on rolling land behind Parkwood Hospital, grew its leafy legacy to Londoners as a result, with more than 225 new trees planted.

The tree planting ceremony honoured the memory of 134 people and five pets, and celebrated 102 individuals, businesses, and organizations.

People plant trees in the Celebration Forest to remember loved ones, say thank you to colleagues and clients, or to celebrate milestones such as births, weddings, anniversaries and retirements. Trees are the perfect gift for any occasion.

As part of the ceremony, all honourees were acknowledged aloud and in print, and special recognition was given to our 2013 Tree Hero, Joni Baechler for all her work on behalf of tree and environmental issues in the City of London.

FINANCIAL REPORT

ReForest London sustained a strong financial position throughout Fiscal 2013 as summarized here. Much of our financial success flows from the strong community support we enjoy and our proven ability to effect change in our neighbourhoods. This in turn draws significant support from foundations and corporations to our mission as well

We planned and carried out more planting projects and delivered more programs across the city than any other year. All funds which were earmarked for specific projects at the end of 2012 were used in accomplishing those projects in 2013. Our fiscal prudence allowed us to adapt well to such a busy year, ending 2013 with a very small deficit (less than 1% of revenue).

Our management controls and financial results are examined through external audit conducted by PricewaterhouseCoopers.

VOLUNTEERS

We love our volunteers! Londoners came out in force – 4,455 of them – to contribute 8,895 hours to make London greener and healthier. ReForest London works with individuals and volunteer groups from schools, businesses, and community organizations throughout London.

A popular and easy commitment for individuals and families alike is planting and caring for trees. Some people also take further training to become Tree Gurus to help lead tree planting projects.

We increased our outreach in 2013 with the help of nearly 100 volunteers who spent 300 hours at our community event booths. These 'tree ambassadors' shared educational materials, gave out seedlings, encouraged participation in London's Million Tree Challenge, and listened to Londoners' concerns about our urban forest. We also had volunteers deliver presentations as part of our new Lunch and Learn program.
