



Warmest average annual temperatures




London's Carolinian Forest


Old North Neighbourhood **39%** canopy cover

There are many benefits that trees provide to your home, neighbourhood and community. Planting trees can impact the value, costs and safety of where you live. Trees are an asset, and their value increases over time!

Make sure to plant trees in your yard and in your neighbourhood to build a more vibrant and healthy environment!

Safety

Well-treed streets encourage pedestrian and bicycle traffic and improve a sense of safety. Tree-lined streets slow traffic. Children are also more likely to walk to school on well-treed streets.

Study after study shows that well-treed communities are safer and healthier. Using data from Toronto, a team of researchers has found that having 10 more trees on your block has self-reported health benefits akin to a \$10,000 salary raise or moving to a neighbourhood with a \$10,000 higher median income or being seven years younger. – The Star, 2015

Community

Planting trees is a great way to empower Trees store carbon dioxide and release and instill community involvement within oxygen back into the air. They remove dust a neighbourhood. Trees bring diverse and particulates, and they absorb ozone, groups of people together and provide a carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide and other space for retreat. pollutants from our air. Trees clean water by filtering runoff and sediment from slopes next to streams, and they recharge groundwater. Value

A well-treed lot can increase your property value by as much as 20% and Planting trees can restore critically needed help to beautify your neighbourhood habitat. Trees provide excellent urban homes streetscape. Once you start digging, for birds, bees and other wildlife. Trees can you'll find your neighbours will too! attract a diversity of wildlife with the food, cover and nest sites that they supply.

Health

Shade from trees cools your yard, Cost making it more pleasant to eat, play, Deciduous trees planted on the south and west side of a home can decrease your cooling costs by up to 50%. Evergreen trees one of the most common forms of that are planted as wind breakers around homes can decrease your heating costs by as much at 30%

Environment

Native Species

- Species that naturally occur within our ecosystem
- Suited to local environment and conditions
- Connected with other native species in the ecosystem

Non-Native Species

- Introduced into our ecosystem from elsewhere
- Not likely to become a threat to native species
- Safe for landscaping but unacceptable for naturalization projects

Invasive Species


- A threat to native species and disrupts local ecosystems
- Has no "enemies" to maintain species levels
- Should be removed when possible


