Neighbourhood ReLeaf gives away free trees to anyone in London.

89% of land in the city is privately owned so in order to have a full healthy urban forest, we need to address private property too.

With a total of 16 tree giveaway events throughout the year, ReForest London successfully distributed an impressive 2,363 new trees to 1079 households across the city. Our team also provides guidance on tree care, educational resources, and workshops that empower Londoners to better care for their trees.

Trees play a crucial role in mitigating the effects of climate change, reducing air pollution, and improving air quality. Moreover, they offer shade, lower urban temperatures, and create a more pleasant and liveable environment. These benefits are highest when trees are planted near where we live and play.

Trees for Teachers

Schoolyards are always in need of trees, and we believe that influencing the values and knowledge of the next generation is key to making environmental progress. For these reasons, ReForest London has been engaging with schools since our inception.

Our Trees for Teachers program not only brings shade trees to schoolyards but also empowers teachers to lead students through the learning process of selecting the right tree species and planting spots. We conducted professional development workshops that attracted 42 educators from across the city, delivering a total of 204 hours of programming. These workshops equip teachers with the knowledge and tools necessary to effectively incorporate environmental education into their curricula. They also empower students to become active participants in environmental conservation.

In addition, we provide completely stocked, ready-to-go seedling growing kits for teachers and their classrooms. Students learn about germinating tree seeds and caring for seedlings, instilling them with a sense of responsibility for nurturing and caring for the environment.

The program's impact extends far beyond the immediate participants; by reaching out to students and educators alike, our program is fostering a culture of environmental consciousness and responsibility within the community. Trees for Teachers plays a vital role in inspiring young minds, cultivating a love for nature, and empowering teachers to integrate environmental education into the classroom.

Westminster Ponds Centre

The Westminster Ponds Centre for Environment and Sustainability continues to grow into a powerful and unique community asset. As a hub and flagship location focusing on community sustainability, the Centre works to create greater local capacity and fuel collaboration and progress toward community sustainability, health, and resilience.

Throughout the year, we collaborated with 16 organizations to deliver a range of Environmental Education workshops, presentations, and events, totaling an impressive 576 programming hours. These collaborations facilitated the dissemination of valuable knowledge and fostered a deeper understanding of environmental issues across diverse audiences in our community.

On the capital side, ReForest London prioritized accessibility upgrades to ensure inclusivity and equal access for all individuals. We successfully installed two accessibility ramps, providing convenient entry to both the Bruce Pavilion for Environmental Action and the Huron Pavilion for Environmental Education.

The ramps were accompanied by barrier-free paths of travel, enabling individuals with mobility challenges to navigate the premises comfortably, as well as a new accessible parking space. Additionally, we constructed an accessible porch at the Huron Pavilion, further enhancing the accessibility and welcoming nature of the Centre.

Our educational programming equips individuals with knowledge and skills inspiring them to take action and make positive changes. Our commitment to accessibility upgrades ensures that everyone, regardless of ability, can participate fully in the Centre's activities and initiatives and be part of fostering a sense of environmental stewardship and building a stronger, more inclusive future for all.

The Aftercare Program stands as a testament to our commitment to the long-term survival and prosperity of newly planted trees within the community. By providing ongoing care and support, this program plays a crucial role in enhancing the health and resilience of the urban forest.

In the past year, we held 15 successful Aftercare events, bringing together volunteers and tree enthusiasts to nurture and maintain the planted trees. Thanks to the collective efforts of the volunteers and the program's meticulous attention to tree care, an impressive 70% tree survival rate has been achieved.

The Seed Hub Program is a commendable initiative that focuses on collecting and preserving native seeds to support biodiversity and ecological restoration efforts.

Through a series of 13 events, the program successfully gathered an impressive total of over 14,000 native seeds.

Financial Report

Both revenue and expenses have increased slightly compared to 2021 as we have returned to near-normal operating levels. While we continue to grow our corporate partnerships and earned revenue, ReForest London remains reliant on and focused on raising new grant money each year. We are also investing in the Environment and Sustainability Centre, which is reflected in an increased value of Property, Premises, and Equipment, as well as a decrease in deferred revenue.

Building our Restricted Operating and Capital Reserves has become an increasingly important part of ReForest London's long-term financial plan. Significant strides were made in this area in 2022, including utilizing our operating surplus to meet our desired contributions. ReForest London has an active Finance and Audit Committee that oversees and quides our operations and reportina. PricewaterhouseCoopers LLC serves as our independent external auditor and has issued an unmodified or "clean" audit opinion on the 2022 financial statements.
